5. Khao Sok National Park, Thailand

Welcome to *Jurassic Park* – you can almost hear the theme song playing in surround sound while you venture between the soaring limestone karsts. Add a prancing Tyrannosaurus rex and **Thailand's** first protected preserve would be a dead ringer for Crichton's prehistoric Disneyland. This dripping, juicy jungle is part of the oldest rainforest in the world, where snakes, monkeys and tigers lurk within the tangle of lazy vines. The park also features the world's largest flower, the Rafflesia kerrii, which can reach over 80cm in diameter. It has no roots or leaves of its own; instead it lives parasitically inside the roots of the liana plant.

The air-con bus from Bangkok takes 10 hours and costs around 450THB; a minibus from Phuket is about 4000THB. For more information see www.khaosok.com.

2. Chatuchak, Thailand

This **Bangkok** weekend market (actually a 'minicity') has to be seen to be believed. Over its 14 hectares **Chatuchak** contains between 9000 and 15,000 stalls (depending on what's on and who's doing the counting) and it attracts 200,000 visitors per day. Come here for Thai handicrafts and antiques among many other delights, but don't come here on hot, humid days – pressed against all that flesh, you might faint or fade away. To get there take the skytrain to Mo Chit station or the metro to Suan Chatuchak station.

5. Chiang Mai, Thailand

The Chiang Mai market opens after sundown and it's 'bargain city'. Fancy a fake Rolex? Get it here. Pirate DVDs? You got it. Fabrics, silks, sunglasses, gems, it's all here, as are swords and chicken feet. The centrepiece is the Night Bazaar Building, three floors of all this and more. Bargain for all you're worth for a rollicking good time. Every Sunday, head to Royal Avenue (Ratchadamnern Road) in the old city. This market is not to be confused with the Night Bazaar on Chan Klan Road.

Standing at the crossroads of India, China and Oceania, **Thai** cuisine is like a best-of of all three's techniques and ingredients. Dishes generally go in hard with garlic and chillies (especially the *phrik khii nuu* variety, which literally translates as 'mouseshit peppers'). Other signature ingredients include lime juice, coriander and lemon grass, which give the cuisine its characteristic tang. Legendary fish sauce or shrimp paste looks after the salt.

Thailand's economic freedom score is 64.9, making its economy the 60th freest in the 2012 *Index*. Its score is 0.2 point better than last year due to gains in four of the 10 economic freedoms, including business freedom and labor freedom. Thailand is ranked 10th out of 41 countries in the Asia–Pacific region, and its overall score is higher than the world and regional averages.
